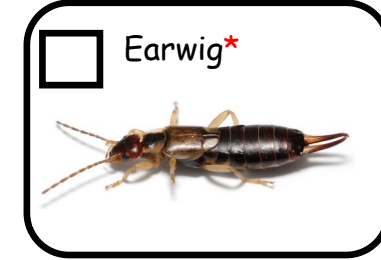
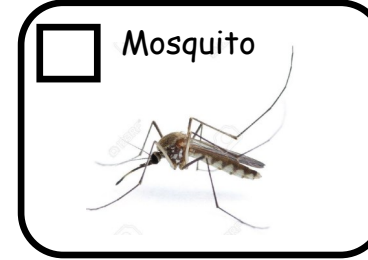
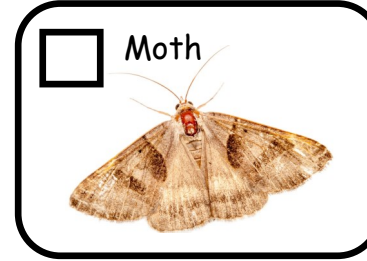
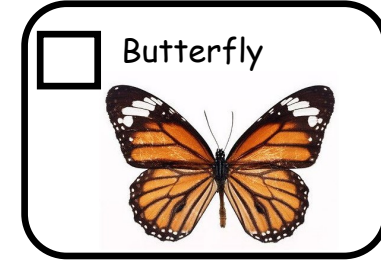
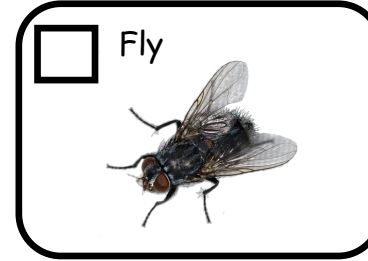
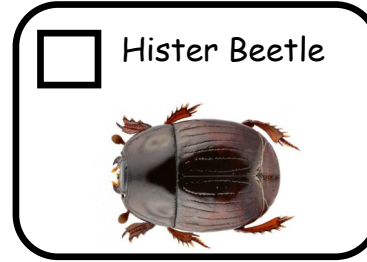
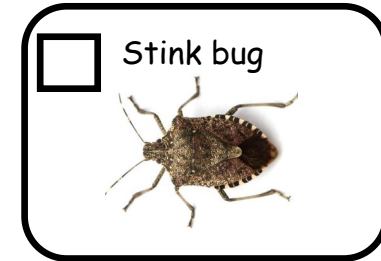
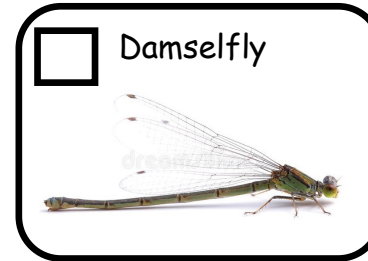
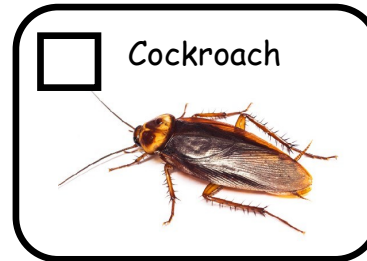
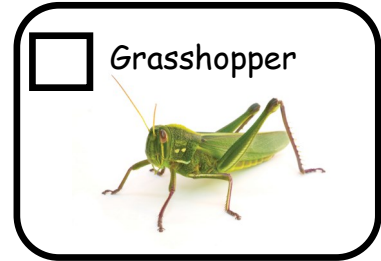
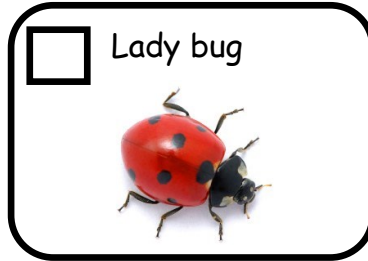
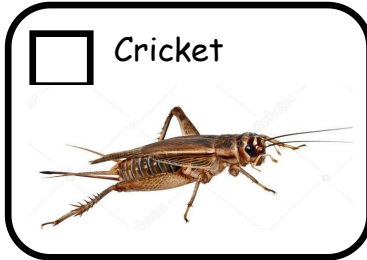
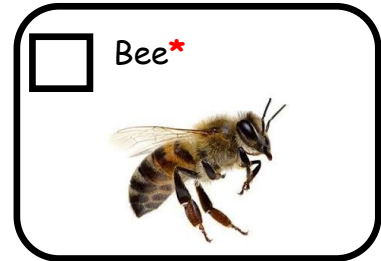
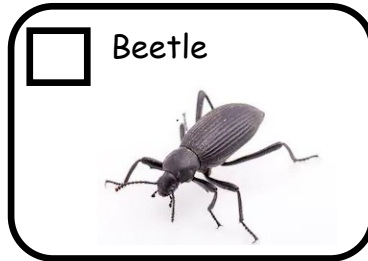
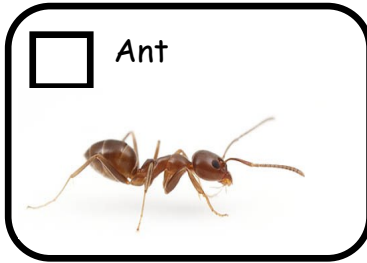


# Bug Scavenger Hunt

Did you know spiders, worms, snails, and pill bugs are invertebrates like insects but are not considered insects? Why do you think? *Hint: look at their body shape.*
